Discussion & Reflection Questions



Date: 7/5/2020

Sermon: "Open My Eyes, So I May See," 2 Kings 6:8-23

Main Point: As we nurture a deep personal relationship with God, he replaces our spiritual blindness with supernatural sight, enabling us to make God-centered choices that honor him.

Discussion/Reflection Questions:

Sunday:

Reflect on the fact that we can go through each day not realizing that we are spiritually blind. This week, let this be your daily prayer: "Lord, open my eyes, so I may see. Help me to clearly sense your presence and power today."

Monday:

Read 2 Kings 6:8-12. What gets the king of Aram so agitated and what does he initially suspect? What stands out to you about Elisha and his relationship with God? What steps can you take to nurture a deeper relationship with God in order to improve your spiritual sight?

Tuesday:

Read 2 Kings 6:13-17. In what sense is Elisha's servant spiritually blind? What do we miss when we forget to turn our eyes to God and just react to what we see in our immediate situation? What are the big issues in your life that are surrounding you and threatening your trust in God right now?

Wednesday:

Review 2 Kings 6:13-17. How does everything change for Elisha's servant when God enables him to have clear spiritual sight? Reflect on a situation when you didn't have enough resources on your own strength, but God ended up providing all you needed and more.

Thursday:

Read 2 Kings 6:18-23. In what sense are the Arameans spiritually blind, and how do they experience grace? What do unbelievers miss when they choose to go after worldly pursuits instead of godly pursuits? Who are some unbelievers that you'll be praying for this week?

Friday:

Spend some quality time with God in prayer. Make a list of people (believers and unbelievers) that God is leading you to pray for. As you pray for each person, ask: "Lord, open their eyes, so they may see."
